PALM BEACH CIRCUIT COURT

A jury found that a three-vehicle accident did not cause a woman's injuries.

In October 2003, Kimberly Beckinsale was rear-ended by a vehicle pushed into her by a third vehicle driven by Nary Ramdass. Beckinsale claimed cervical disc herniations were related to the crash and required surgery.

Defense counsel disputed causation. The defense's medical experts testified there were no signs of an acute crash injury and the surgery was not connected to the accident.
